## Silicon Valley Bridge


Dear Ray

When opponents preempt you out of your shoes, you are likely to require some time to get over the shock before considering your next call. If the auction goes **1NT**-(**PASS**)-**3NT** to you, it may not take you long to realize that this isn't the third time in the history of the game that you ought to bid. Law

73D, however, requires that you give away neither your consternation nor your certainty. The best practice, whether looking for your shoes or noticing how closely this hand looks like your system notes, you are expected to study your hand *as if you had something to consider* before making your next call in tempo (about 10 seconds). Technically, this requirement applies even when one of your opponents places the final contract at **6NT** after a 5-level response to their bad slam prevention convention. Give them about 10 seconds to fear that you are about to **double** them. And, with that thought, I'll see you at the tables!
